Toll4Europe Receives RDW Certification for Dutch Truck Tolls

Toll4Europe has completed certification by the Dutch toll collector RDW (Rijksdienst voor het Wegverkeer). This means the EETS (European Electronic Toll Service) provider will be ready to process payments when the Dutch truck toll system launches on July 1, 2026, and will expand its European network to 17 countries.

Dr. Felix Wex, CEO of Toll4Europe, on the completed RDW certification:

“With the RDW certification for the new Dutch toll system, we are ensuring a seamless launch for freight forwarders starting July 1 – from the very first day tolls are in effect, without delays and without compromises.

For our sales partners, this approval means concrete planning security. They can confidently assure their customers that tolls in the Dutch toll domain will be billed via the existing EETS OBU, without any additional hardware or separate contracts.

This expands our EETS network to 17 countries with 18 toll domains. Each new country closes a gap that previously meant extra effort and complexity for transport companies. This allows us to continue our European growth strategy as planned.”

Toll4Europe is a German EETS (European Electronic Toll Service) provider that enables transport companies to manage cross-border toll billing with just a single On-Board Unit (OBU). As a joint venture between T-Systems Road User Services, Daimler Truck, DKV Mobility, and euroShell, its goal is to cover all of Europe via a single EETS platform. Toll4Europe is currently active in 17 European countries – including Germany, the Netherlands, Belgium, and Poland – with more in the pipeline. In addition to toll billing, Toll4Europe offers value-added services, including tracking and tracing, as well as an app for truck drivers featuring a digital parking spot finder. In addition, the company is actively involved at the European level, including through its participation in AETIS (Association of Electronic Toll and Interoperable Services), chaired by Toll4Europe CEO Dr. Felix Wex, the EETS Facilitation Platform (EFP), and the BGL (Federal Association of Road Haulage, Logistics, and Waste Management), to help shape the future of European toll systems and the interests of the transport industry.
